



CODE OF CONDUCT

MINI AND YOUTH CLUB

- Strathcona Druids RFC is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with their team manager or the Director of Mini and Youth rugby as applicable.
- As a member of Strathcona Druids RFC you are expected to abide by the following mini/youth section rules:
 - All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
 - All members must respect their opponents.
 - Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
 - Members must wear a suitable kit including rugby or football boots with either molded rubber studs or kitemarked rugby studs for safety. Mouthguards are recommended for all age groups but compulsory for all contact groups for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
 - Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly or arrange an alternative method of payment with your team manager.
 - Mini/Youth members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions. Smoking (by adult or youth) is not allowed in the clubhouse at any time. The Club is subject to the smoking bylaw for Strathcona County
 - Junior members under the age of 18 are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
